How is your life different as a result of going to the Chatter & Natter table?

From the first visit, everyone was incredibly welcoming and friendly. I don't know what I was worried about. Last year we got together for a Christmas dinner, and we are planning the same thing this year.

The Chatter & Natter group is hosted by Anita, a fabulous volunteer who is brilliant at bringing people together. Anita takes every opportunity when she is out and about to spread the word about the group and invite anyone to come along. The group is a mix of men and women of various ages.

"The group is a lifeline for me and for many others who join, giving us a reason to get together, make friends and off-load. Everyone is so kind and supportive."

Some of the people who attend also come along to my chair aerobics class and it's been great that I've been able to offer my skills to help improve fitness.

Quite often people living by the coast don't have immediate family members living nearby, and you can see how pleased they are after finding the group.

"Some of the attendees got together in the summer and went on holiday together for a long weekend, they had an absolute ball and wouldn't have met each other if it wasn't for the Chatter & Natter group."
